CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

HIGHLAND HIGH SCHOOL

Scholarship: 3.50 weighted grade point average cumulative through the end of the previous school year (allow first semester of senior year as probationary period); be enrolled in an average of two honors classes per year (grades 10-11-12); be in eleventh or twelfth grade.

Leadership: actively participate in two or more school and/or community activities; be resourceful, dependable and responsible; have positive attitude toward school.

Service: be actively involved in three or more school and/or community service projects; maintain loyal school attitude; volunteer assistance to school and community; show courtesy by assisting visitors, teachers, and other students at school; work well with others in service-related projects.

Character: take criticism willingly; accept recommendations; be cheerful, friendly, poised, stable; uphold principles of morality and ethics; cooperate and comply with school regulations; demonstrate highest standards of honesty and reliability; show courtesy, concern, and respect for others; manifest truthfulness by avoiding cheating and gaining profit by the mistakes of others; actively help rid the school of bad influences or environment.

Dismissal Procedures: Failure to maintain the standards above will result in dismissal. Warnings on a limited basis will be given during membership except in the case of a flagrant violation of school rules or civil laws. A student who is dismissed or who resigns may never again become a member of the National Honor Society.
